(Kahnawake – 28, Onerahtokha/April 2025) Tehsakotitsén:tha Kateri Memorial Hospital Centre (KMHC) is pleased to advise the public that the COVID-19 outbreak within its Long Term Care units has officially ended.

Regular visits have now resumed in both units. The Short Term Care unit was not affected by the outbreak.

The outbreak was declared on 9, Onerahtókha/April, 2025.

KMHC wishes to thank staff, visitors and residents for their cooperation in helping limit and contain the outbreak. “Most of our residents are vaccinated, which really helped lessen the effects of the virus,” said Director of Nursing and Community Care Robin Guyer. “However, we will always remain vigilant and will always take all necessary actions to mitigate any outbreaks.”

“The fact that outbreaks can still occur should be a reminder that anyone who has any cold or flu-like symptoms should always avoid visiting residents,” she added. “And simple actions like hand washing are still very effective at stopping the spread of these viruses.”
